# Opening Times

**Preschool Playgroup :** Monday to Friday  
9:00am-12:00pm 12:30-3:00pm (Term Time)

Our children attending New Ark Preschool learn through play using our fantastic facilities, which includes an Adventure Playground, City Farm and Eco Centre.

**Toddler Group :** Wednesday 1:00-2.30pm (Term Time)

Our parent/carer and toddler group are weekly sessions for children aged 0-4 years, giving them the time to explore our Eco Centre and City Farm with their family.

**Play Support Service :** Monday to Friday 9:00am-3:00pm (Term Time)

In our Play Support Service we offer specialist support and an alternative outdoor curriculum for children with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties who are on a reduced timetable and/or at risk of exclusion from school.

**Adventure Playground :** 3.45-6:00pm (Term Time) 8:30am-5:30pm (School Holidays)

During term time our After School Club is all about adventure play with activities such as digging, building, ball games, swinging and climbing; and other activities based around a range of creative arts and crafts. The children also have the opportunity to visit the farm.

During the school holidays the children also get the opportunity to do baking in our kitchen, outdoor cooking, den building, water slides, messy play and more.

(As a guide New Ark follows Newark Hill Academy's term timetable)

**City Farm :** Monday to Friday 10:00am-12:00pm 2.00pm-5.00pm

During session time the children attending our Playgroup, Play Support Service, After School Club and Holiday Club get the opportunity to visit our City Farm and help to care for our animals. That includes grooming, feeding and cleaning out our small animal hutches. We also welcome family and group visits and visitors during term times and school holidays.

# Preschool Report

During the spring and summer terms of 2021, we continued to work through COVID-19 measures to keep everyone safe. Our children have continued to follow hygiene routines including washing their hands upon arrival – it's safe to say they have become experts at this!



New Ark welcomed Nicole to the pre-school team in April 2021. However unfortunately said goodbye to our Eco Leader Emma in December 2021 who helped to deliver exciting opportunities for our children in the Eco Centre.

Since the world has reopened after COVID-19, the children have been able to access new opportunities. We have been on numerous walks around the local area including collecting natural resources, looking at road signs, visiting the library bus and enjoying a few babyccino's at Sainsbury's.

Children have been engaging in all areas of learning including activities led by adults, spontaneous play and by trial and error. In particular, we have focused on social skills, speech and language and independence skills, as these are skills which have been less cultivated as a result of lockdown.





Here's just a few of the activities our children have experienced:

- Frequent Visits to the farm where children have had the opportunity to pet rabbits and guinea pigs, and feeding the animals
- Celebrating various cultural events including decorating tealight holders for Diwali
- Making pancakes and having pancake races on the playground
- Performing our nativity at Christmas time
- Making chocolate nests at Easter and going on our own egg hunt
- Learning about Remembrance Day by making craft poppies and watching commemorative educational videos
- Celebrating Chinese New Year by making our own dragon and trying numerous Chinese food goods (thanks to a very kind donation from one of our parents)
- Visiting our eco garden to go pond dipping for tadpoles and on mini beast hunts

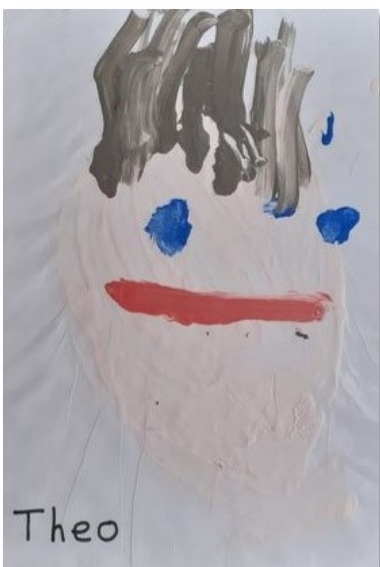

# What Ofsted say about New Ark

New Ark was inspected by Ofsted on 12 May 2021. The inspector was very impressed by the quality of the provision for our children and rated us as 'Good' in all areas.

**The Inspector praised New Ark's unique provision** and applauded the fact that our team work hard to ensure **our children's feelings, voices and choices are respected** and they are **encouraged to think critically and use their imagination** as they enjoy playing and exploring our wide range of activities.

*'Children are confident, articulate and friendly. They enjoy participating in a wide range of activities available to them at this unique provision. For example, they learn about animal care at the on-site farm, on play equipment in the extensive outdoor area. Parents also appreciate how much these activities benefit all aspects of their children's development.'*

*'Children demonstrate a positive attitude to learning, which will support them well when they move on to school. They are eager to interact with each other and adults. Consequently, they develop their communication and language skills well.'*

*'Staff have a clear knowledge about what each child can do and what they need to learn next. The curriculum is planned so that each child enjoys rich learning opportunities and makes good progress in their learning and development. This is testified by parents.'*

*'Children show good physical skills as they navigate the obstacle course outside. They are able to balance on wooden blocks, climb, slide, and jump a given number of times on the small trampoline.'*

*'Staff effectively support those children who require extra support. They work well with parents and other professionals to ensure that children fulfil their potential.'*



# Playground Report

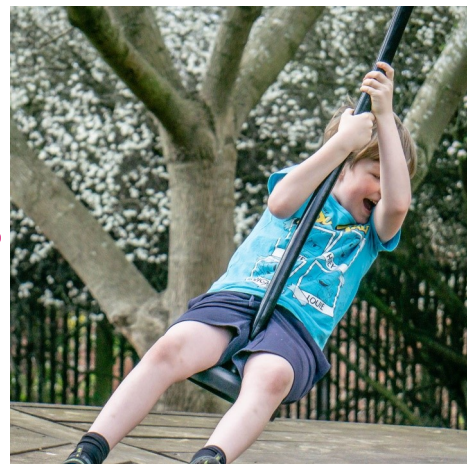
Although we were still governed by a lot of COVID-19 restrictions, we were pleased to be able to offer our **Summer Holiday Club** during 2021. With much delight we saw returning children that had used our facilities pre-pandemic, and we also welcomed lots of new children.

"My children came for the first time today and joined the holiday club. They absolutely loved it!! So much for them to do, junk modelling, Lego, lots of outdoor play with a real emphasis on children being children! The staff were so friendly and we can't wait to return tomorrow!"



We offered a **variety of different activities**; painting, clay work, cutting and sticking, waterplay, experimenting with our mud kitchen, bug-hunting and visits to our farm (to name just a few!). During this period, we had to ensure we followed the required COVID-19 measures to keep all children, parents, carers and staff safe. Everyone adapted to these, followed the guidelines daily and were absolutely brilliant throughout. We still continue with some hygiene measures in all our services and children follow these as part of their normal daily routine.

We were blessed with some good weather which meant that children still enjoyed the **many exciting outdoor play opportunities** on offer, using our vast outdoor area accessing both the **Adventure Playground** and **Eco Centre**. At New Ark it doesn't matter what the weather is like, **we always encourage our children to play outside** regardless - providing it is safe - to jump in puddles or to roll in the mud! It was brilliant to see the children having lots of fun from playing football, playing with water, painting outdoors and visiting our **City Farm**.



Children can attend full days from 8.30am - 5.30pm or parents/carers can choose hours that they need.

Each day we plan activities for our children which take into consideration their many different ages and development stages. We have a dedicated team of playworkers who work hard to make New Ark the special place it is today for all children to experience.

In September 2021 we opened our doors to resume our Afterschool Club. We pick up **children from Newark Hill Academy Primary School each day**, and they receive a light snack and drink and time to play until they are collected. Our **walkover service is invaluable to many working parents** and the number of children attending keeps increasing.

For those children that do not attend Newark Hill Academy, children are welcome to join each evening and can be dropped off to attend sessions from 3.45pm until 6pm.

October 2022 saw many of our children engaged in Halloween-themed activities; colouring in pictures and cutting and sticking coloured tissue paper to make pumpkins. In November and December we prepared for Christmas, making Christmas tree decorations and Christmas cards. The children enjoyed playing hide and seek in the dark outside (all carefully supervised).

In January 2022 the children enjoyed using the dressing up clothes, playing in our home corner, playing restaurants or visiting our farm animals. In February we made valentine cookies.

**At New Ark there are always new adventures to be had** and our children love playing outdoors, taking part in team games, balancing on the trim trail, making outdoor music, helping with the tasks on the City Farm and feeding the animals.

In February 2022, like many businesses we were hit hard by rising utility bills and this meant that we had to increase our fees for all our services that we provide. We endeavour to keep our fees as low as we can and are always looking for new sources of help and funding in support of this. We'd love to hear from individuals and organisations that could help us with fundraising, offer some time and resources to complete maintenance tasks, provide sponsorship of a child or sponsor an animal on our farm.

# Play Support Service Report

Our Play Support Service is a unique provision which provides support to children who are experiencing social, emotional and behavioural difficulties, and who are at risk of exclusion from school.

Our alternative curriculum utilises our therapeutic approach and unique setting - which includes a City Farm, Adventure Playground and Eco woodland garden - and gives us opportunities to support children in the development of their life skills. Particular emphasis is placed upon improving their social and emotional development and communication skills, and our aim is to see happy children returning to full time education.

During the last year, as COVID-19 restrictions have lifted, our attendance figures have started to gradually rebuild and we have been excited to once again have the opportunity to offer children a wide range of activities to enjoy and learn from.

We have made great use of all that our site has to offer. Our cabin provides a quiet space to enjoy games, puzzles, craft activities and toys - in addition to some social time with a drink and all important biscuit. In our Eco Centre the children have enjoyed a variety of activities to develop their understanding and love of the natural world; including bug hunts, pond dipping, metal detecting and creating bird boxes and feeders. They have also helped to maintain our gardens by planting seeds, watering and taking care of our vegetable bath (with varied success!)

On the farm we have worked closely with Carolyn and James, who supported us in providing the children with opportunities to develop their skills. Daily tasks and responsibilities such as feeding and watering our animals and birds, collecting eggs and general farm maintenance have all proved very popular and successful in helping our children increase their confidence and feel valued. Afterwards the children particularly enjoy some time handling and grooming, which provides some quiet time to relax with their chosen animal.

We were recently joined by a wonderful team of young people and staff leaders from the Prince's Trust and several of our children really benefited from working alongside these young people to improve our site - a truly positive experience for all involved.

Our Play Support Service has seen much success this year in helping children to develop their self-confidence and self-esteem, behaviour management and emotional wellbeing to enable them to return to full time education. Now more than ever there are increased numbers of children who are struggling in schools. We look forward to continuing to provide much needed help and support to help them thrive and achieve positive outcomes.

# Farm Report

It's been another busy year for us here on the farm and despite the lingering effects of COVID-19 restrictions and financial challenges, we have continued to care for and keep our farm animals well fed and healthy, providing our unique community resource for all to enjoy.



The caring environment and hard work of staff and volunteers has enabled our farm to flourish with many welcomed new additions of rabbits, chicks, and most recently Cheddar our English Black Pig, who we were pleased to be able to rehome.

We have a wide and varied group of people who come to the farm throughout the year and we welcome regular visits from children attending our Toddler sessions, Preschool and Play Support Service who benefit greatly from engaging in tasks and activities on the farm, and the therapeutic effects of animal handling and grooming. We have a number of adults with additional needs who similarly find the farm a safe and supportive environment in which to socialise and build their confidence and skills.



Many local schools, colleges and adult support groups have enjoyed experiencing our facilities and we have regular visits from a number of local special schools including Marshfields and Medeshamstede.

We have delivered our in-house animal care course to students with additional needs from the John Mansfield Campus at Peterborough City College and provided work placements for students undertaking animal care qualifications.

We have also offered opportunities for young people working towards the Duke of Edinburgh Award to undertake enrichment activities.





We have continued to provide birthday party experiences on our farm and Eco Centre, which have proved very popular this year.

The dedication and generosity of volunteers in addition to strong community links have helped tremendously throughout the

year. In March we were lucky enough to have a visit from a Princes Trust group who were invaluable in providing materials and a makeover for the farm and our Eco Centre. They worked very hard giving a variety of furniture and structures a fresh coat of paint, and replenishing the gravel on the farm,



Financial challenges have certainly had an impact but we have been busy fundraising with a variety of activities, including taking some of our small animals to Serpentine Green Shopping Centre, where we were able to raise awareness about New Ark's facilities and services. We were extremely proud when one of our young people who attends the farm on a placement from the John Mansfield Campus at Peterborough City College set up and ran her own fund-raising activity to raise money for New Ark.

Here at the farm we rely heavily on support from local volunteers and donations to help fund the wonderful work we do and would like to thank all our volunteers and supporters whose hard work and contributions to the farm really do make such a difference.

# Treasurer's Report

It has been another challenging year for New Ark due to the continued impact of COVID-19 and things were very quiet at the start of the year. Slowly but surely the children are coming back, which is positive to see.



We had our **Christmas Wonderland** in December 2021, which was our first fundraising event since before the pandemic, It was so lovely to be able to invite our children, families and supporters back to the site in larger numbers and the event went well.

We also had our **Good Friday Family Fun Day and Easter Egg Hunt** in April 2022 (the first for nearly three years!). We were really unsure how this would go, but need not have worried as it was EXTREMELY busy and really enjoyed by the many families that attended, as feedback showed.

We embarked on a fund-raising campaign during February 2022 in support of our COVID-19 recovery plan and in a bid to combat our dramatically rising energy costs.
