Opening Times

Preschool : Monday to Friday 9.00am-12:00pm and 12:30-3:00pm (Term Time)

We can offer morning, afternoon and all day sessions for children from age 2 years. Our children attending New Ark Preschool learn through play using our fantastic facilities, which includes an Adventure Playground, City Farm and Eco Centre.



Toddler Group : Wednesday 1:00-2.30pm (Term Time)

Our parent/carer and toddler group is a weekly session for children aged 0-4 years, giving them the time to explore our Eco Centre and City Farm with their family.

Play Support Service : Monday to Friday 9:00am-3:00pm (Term Time)

In our Play Support Service we offer specialist support and an alternative outdoor curriculum for children with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties who are on a reduced timetable and/or at risk of exclusion from school.

Adventure Playground : Monday to Friday 3.45-6:00pm (Term Time) 8:30am-5:30pm (School Holidays)

During term time our After School Club is all about adventure play with activities such as digging, building, ball games, swinging and climbing; and other activities based around a range of creative arts and crafts. The children also have the opportunity to visit the farm.

During the school holidays the children also get the opportunity to do baking in our kitchen, outdoor cooking, den building, water slides, messy play and more.

(As a guide New Ark follows Newark Hill Academy's term timetable)

City Farm : Monday to Friday by appointment between 10:00am-12:00pm and 2.00pm-4.00pm Open for public visits after 4pm. (Term Time)

Monday to Friday 10:00am-12:00pm and 2.00pm-5.00pm (School Holidays)

During session times the children attending our Playgroup, Play Support Service, After School Club and Holiday Club get the opportunity to visit our City Farm and help to care for our animals. This includes grooming, feeding and cleaning out our small animal hutches. We also welcome family and group visits and visitors during term times and school holidays. The farm is also now operating as a Social Community Hub for Social Prescribing (see farm report).

Preschool Report

What a fabulous year we had at pre-school once all restrictions surrounding Covid-19 were finally lifted!

During the 2022 spring term we celebrated Easter with our own egg hunt and lots of craft activities. The children went shopping for snacks at Sainsbury's and enjoyed a cheeky babycino in their café too. During April, we covered 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' where we learnt about the life cycle of butterflies and chose our own foods that the hungry caterpillar ate and painted them! In May, we continued learning about life cycles as the children observed the frogspawn, tadpoles and frogs over in our Eco Centre.

We enjoyed the summer weather in June and July as the children spent lots of time on the grass including the trim trail, slide and rocket ladder! We also held our first Teddy Bear's Leaver's Picnic since 2019!

September was the start of a new school year as we welcomed new families and returning families back. We got to know our children by drawing portraits of ourselves, whilst the children explored what New Ark has to offer by spending time at the farm and inside our new sensory room!

During October, we welcomed the autumn weather and collected our own natural resources from pine cones to conkers and leaves. During our weekly Eco sessions, we made a hedgehog house to help shelter our local animals ready for winter. We also made Halloween biscuits and spooky pictures!



In November, we recognised Remembrance Day by painting poppies and watching a Cbeebies video.

Throughout December, the children were very busy filming our nativity and completing lots of Christmas crafts. On our last day of term, the children enjoyed a Christmas party before we welcomed families in to watch our Nativity together!



During January 2023, the Police visited us with their van which the children loved looking inside of!

February marked Pancake Day where we ate lots for snack and ran our own races too. We also made our own life size Superheroes cut-outs.



In March, we enjoyed the snowy weather, making our own mini snowmen and snow-angels! April brought us showers so we spent lots of time jumping in muddy puddles!



New Ark Pre-School is unique as it's the only pre-school in the city where children regularly visit a city farm as well as having the opportunity to participate in onsite Eco sessions.

What Ofsted say about New Ark

New Ark was inspected by Ofsted on 12 May 2021. The inspector was very impressed by the quality of the provision for our children and rated us as 'Good' in all areas.

The Inspector praised New Ark's unique provision and applauded the fact that our team work hard to ensure our children's feelings, voices and choices are respected and they are encouraged to think critically and use their imagination as they enjoy playing and exploring our wide range of activities.

'Children are confident, articulate and friendly. They enjoy participating in a wide range of activities available to them at this unique provision. For example, they learn about animal care at the on-site farm, on play equipment in the extensive outdoor area. Parents also appreciate how much these activities benefit all aspects of their children's development.'

Children demonstrate a positive attitude to learning, which will support them well when they move on to school. They are eager to interact with each other and adults. Consequently, they develop their communication and language skills well.

Staff have a clear knowledge about what each child can do and what they need to learn next. The curriculum is planned so that each child enjoys rich learning opportunities and makes good progress in their learning and development. This is testified by parents.

Children show good physical skills as they navigate the obstacle course outside. They are able to balance on wooden blocks, climb, slide, and jump a given number of times on the small trampoline.

Staff effectively support those children who require extra support. They work well with parents and other professionals to ensure that children fulfil their potential.'

Playground Report

As always, our children have had fun at New Ark - especially during the summer holidays when there was a lot of laughter using the water slide. This was a welcomed activity during the hottest days to help us all cool down (adults included!).



We also watched a fabulous magic show, learnt new sewing skills, as well as learning to make origami figures, creating clay models, and painting, Boxing Futures visited weekly and we all took part in many activities to build our fitness.

Our Holiday Club and After School Club is based around children making their own play choices, they can choose to be inside, outdoors, or on the farm. Our outdoor area is so big, children love making up games especially those that involve chasing each other, Hide and Seek and especially when it rains, jumping in and running through puddles!

During the holidays, school age children can bring their packed lunch and spend the day with us for £24 per day, per child, Alternatively they can come and play for part of the day at a cost of £5.00 per hour.



As part of our After School Club, you will see us collecting children from Newark Hill Academy from 3.15pm, the children are then walked from the school over to New Ark. We offer a light snack and refreshments all for £8.00 per evening, per child (or £7.00 per evening, per child from 3.45pm-6pm without the walkover).

Play is an important part of a child's learning and development. At New Ark children thrive, develop their confidence and self esteem, improve their gross and fine motor skills, and learn important life skills through the many different activities that we offer. We also very much enjoy children putting their creative ideas forward and experimenting with these.



HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) Programme

It was during summer holiday 2022 that we provided the HAF Programme for the first time which is funded by the Department for Education. This is aimed at families in receipt of benefit related free school meals. In addition to offering a wide range of fun and creative activities, we provided hot and cold meals for the children during four weeks of the summer holidays.

It was very successful, with all the children enjoying their time spent with us and we have continued to provide this during Christmas, Easter and the most recent summer school holidays. Our next HAF Programme will be taking place during the Christmas Holiday 2023.

Thank you to all our dedicated staff who ensure all children are given many positive experiences. Thank you also to our trustees who voluntarily give their valuable time in helping New Ark grow.

Play Support Service Report

The Play Support Service is a unique provision which provides support to children who are experiencing social, emotional, and behavioural difficulties, and are at risk of exclusion from school.

Our therapeutic approach and unique setting, which includes our Eco Centre, City Farm and Adventure Playground, allows us opportunities to support children in the development of their life skills.

Particular emphasis is placed upon social and

emotional development

and communication skills. Our planned outcomes are to see happy children returning to school.

During this year, we've been excited to work with some new local schools in addition to those we have long-established relationships with. The age range of children visiting us this year was from 7-12yrs; all with a variety of likes, dislikes, abilities, and individual needs.

Our sessions start in our cabin,

where we have a chat to find out how everybody's week has been and how the children are feeling today. We then all work together to produce a list of activities and goals for the session. The children respond very well to this, both as a visual timetable, and in providing them with a sense of achievement when proudly ticking off completed tasks.

New Ark's varied resources provide us with the scope to offer our children many and varied activities.

Here are a few that have been enjoyed this year:

Support Cabin – Group games, including 'Uno flip', 'Frustration', Connect 4, 'N Tropy', Bingo and 'Go Fish'. Puzzles, Lego, small world play, magnets, and craft activities. Social time, including drinks and biscuits.

Eco Centre – Planting bulbs, watering, painting bird boxes, bug hunting, pond dipping, Metal detecting and fossil hunting.

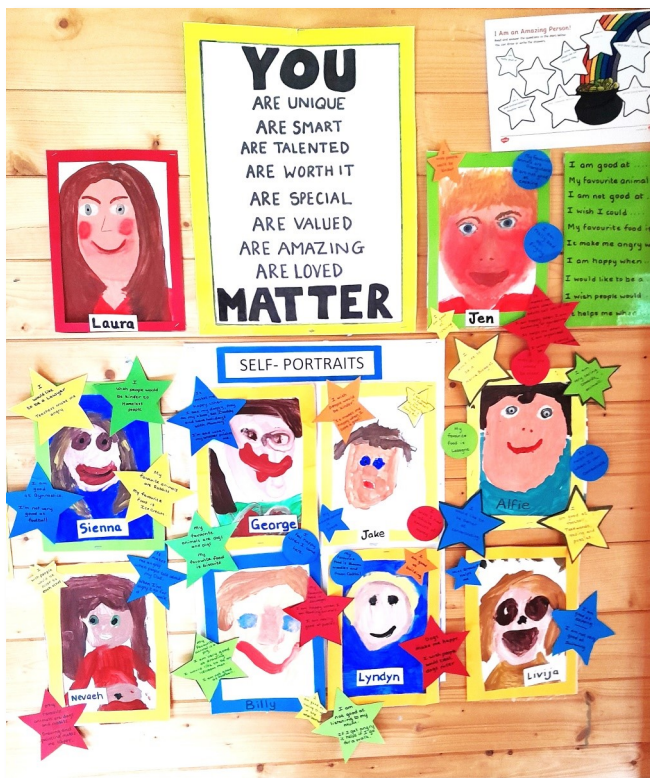
Adventure Playground – Exploration, climbing, balancing and risk management.

Farm – Animal feeding, food prep and transporting (wheelbarrow), sweeping, cleaning hutches, filling water vessels, egg collecting/testing, and quiet time to relax and snuggle up to our small animals.

In addition to our weekly activities, some of our children also helped us to prepare for New Ark events – tidying the farm and creating posters for our open day; sorting donations, making games, and decorating for our Winter Festival.

All our activities are designed to be achievable, stimulating, and fun, whilst also helping our children to develop their social skills, communication, and self-confidence. We've continued to work closely with Carolyn and James, who have been invaluable in supporting us with activities on the Farm.

The Farm and animal tasks provide opportunities for the children to

experience personal achievement, to contribute to our animals' welfare and to feel valued.

During the year we've enjoyed a close relationship with many parents and schools and received some great feedback regarding the children's progress. It's been truly rewarding to

work with, and witness the achievements of some wonderful children, throughout the year.

Unfortunately, there continues to be increased numbers of children and young people who are unable to remain in education and in need of support to continue their learning. At New Ark Play Support Service, we embrace the opportunities to work with these children, helping to provide them with the tools and self-confidence to reach their true potential.

Farm Report

Another year on the farm has flown by, during which we've continued to work hard to care for our animals and those who visit us. Our birds and larger animal friends (Cheddar the pig, Cyrano the pony, and Summer the sheep) have throughout the year been joined by numerous rabbit and guinea pig donations, all needing our care and attention.



Cheddar is flourishing (and she's enormous) and is proving a firm favourite with our volunteers and visitors alike. Many of our dedicated volunteers who work through all weathers also kindly sponsor our animals. Animal sponsorship is invaluable in helping us to provide food, hay, straw, and pay vet bills, all of which have considerably increased in price.

"I am a teacher, who brings primary children to New Ark every Friday. They learn amazing new skills - feeding animals, collecting eggs, and making friends with others. My students really enjoy the calm and therapeutic setting. It brings them joy and helps them learn about nature in a peaceful and inclusive setting."

In addition to our wonderful volunteers, we have welcomed many visitors to our farm this year, such as school groups from local primary and secondary schools who have enjoyed learning about our animals and having the chance to handle them. We were also visited by a nursery who were really excited to have some lovely close interactions with our animals, in addition to playtime in our Eco Centre.

We have worked with a number of fantastic students, supporting them in completing their animal care/work experience studies.



We have worked closely with our Play Support Service colleagues to provide farm tasks and activities for their children, which is an invaluable resource in children's development and wellbeing.



"The child I visit New Ark with thoroughly enjoys his time there. His favourite activity is collecting eggs on the Farm and checking them for freshness. He is very fond of the chickens and turkeys and loves a cuddle with the guinea pigs. The staff have a great knowledge and understanding of the children they work with and adapt the activities to the child's needs and likes."

Once again, this year, we were delighted to welcome a group of young people from The Princes Trust. The team worked hard to brighten up our garden areas by painting fences and furniture and filling our planters with beautiful summer flowers.



Here at the farm, we rely heavily on support from local volunteers and donations to help fund the wonderful work we do and would like to thank all our volunteers and supporters whose hard work and contributions to the farm really do make such a difference.

New Ark Social Community Hub

In addition to providing animal care, we have continued to work closely with local community groups, including those supporting adult mental health and additional needs. Our farm provides opportunities for enrichment and building self-esteem and has now become a valuable social prescribing venue/hub.
